




***Spread the word!***  
***STOP ELCON***  
***Hazardous Waste in***  
***Falls Township***

The information below is based on Elcon's Phase One permit, which was approved by PADEP. Elcon is in the process of submitting their Phase Two permit, which may have some varying information.

1. Elcon has proposed to import 210,000 tons or **420,000,000 lb.** of chemical hazardous waste/year to their proposed plant at 100 Dean Sievers Place in the Keystone Industrial complex, Falls Township,
2. More than 1,000,000 lb. per day of toxic waste will be burned using thermal oxidation,
3. This is not an issue of being against manufacturing, but it's an absolutely terrible location to treat such **huge** quantities of hazardous waste,
4. It is less than 1/2 mile from the Delaware River where Falls, LMT, Levittown, Tullytown, Newtown, Langhorne and many other Bucks towns and So Jersey towns get their drinking water;
5. Elcon's wetlands delineation report states that the site is "hydrologically connected to the Biles Creek and the Delaware River." That means an accident that results in hazardous waste being spilled can make it to our drinking water supply,
6. Philadelphia Water Department ran a computer model and found a spill at the proposed site would be "catastrophic" and Philly is 15 miles away. Due to the tides, the spill would impact drinking, bathing, cooking and all water supply for millions of people for almost 4 days,
7. Imagine our schools, hospitals, homes, industry not having water for 4 days. No, really think about it,
8. Of course Elcon tells us not to worry, they will take every precaution...just like BP in the Gulf of Mex, Exxon in Alaska, PP&L coal ash spill in Martins Creek, PA and Freedom Industries chemical spill into the Elk River W. Va. Accidents happen,
9. It's in the 500-year floodplain. The Delaware River Basin Commission's 2009 Floodplain Safety Recommendations and the City of Philadelphia's 2015 Sustainability report both recently recommended, due to climate change, sea-level rise and more frequent severe weather patterns, critical facilities such as hospitals and hazardous waste facilities should be located outside the 500 year floodplain.

10. How many huge tanker trucks will it take to bring 1,000,000 pounds of hazardous waste per day to the proposed facility? How many trains? Google search accidents and see how frequently they wreck,
11. Tons of air-born pollutants from their burners will impact air quality throughout the region, which is already not good.
12. 10,000+ kids attend schools that are within 4 miles of this proposed toxic waste facility. Families live here, breathe the air and drink the water from the river. This is not the location for any hazardous waste facility!
