
Over 60 shade trees were planted on Broad Street, Front Street, and Sixth Avenue as part of a \$15,000 grant Awarded to Florence Township

THE TOWNSHIP OF FLORENCE

The Duffy School Apartments for Senior Citizens was developed by Network Member, Moorestown Ecumenical Neighborhood Development, Inc. (MEND). The Township worked with MEND to develop an apartment building that would come on-line in the former 100-plus year-old school building closed in 2008, with new ones in an addition. The building remaining compliant with all current building codes, meeting the requirements of both the NJ State Historic Preservation Office and the National Trust for Historic Preservation and numerous financing programs. The new development transformed the school into a residential building with 53 one-bedroom apartments, a community room, a gymnasium, an auditorium and other amenities. Communities have school buildings that no longer meet their needs and it is appropriate for the development of new affordable rental housing to be done in Florence.

Tullytown Landfill to close in 2017 after NJ residents' complaints

TULLYTOWN — The Tullytown Landfill will close by May 2017, according to the state Department of Environmental Protection.

The DEP this week issued a two-year permit to Waste Management Inc. of Pennsylvania for two years, rather than the four-year permit the company had sought, according to a news release from the state agency. That means the landfill, which has been in operation since 1988, will close for good, according to DEP spokeswoman Amanda Witman.






