## Press Release 9/30/22

- 1. Florence Township Tax Bill Update: The property tax bills were mailed on August 12<sup>th</sup>. The grace period for the 2022 third quarter tax bill was extended to September 12, 2022. Payments had to be received in the office by September 12, 2022 to avoid interest. Any payment received after September 12<sup>th</sup> will be charged interest back to August 1, 2022.
- 2. The Water Department will be flushing hydrants from September 12<sup>th</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>. Please visit the website <u>https://florence-nj.gov/departments/water-sewer/hydrant-flushing/</u> or call (609) 499-2518 for flushing dates and times in your specific area. During hydrant flushing the water will become cloudy and it is not recommended to wash laundry during or immediately following the flushing procedure in your area. Additionally, it is recommended that you flush your water heater to remove any sediment that may accumulate. Please contact us at 609-499-2518 with any questions you may have concerning hydrant flushing or water quality.
- **3.** Township Projects: The below projects have started. We apologize for any inconvenience these projects may cause the residents.

<u>Sidewalk Project</u>: The following locations will have sidewalk work done over the next few weeks: Birch Hollow Development, Greenbriar Development and The Preserve. Please be aware there will be temporary no parking in these areas. Signs will be posted the day before work will be done.

**<u>2022 Road Program</u>**: W. 2<sup>nd</sup> from Broad to Boulevard St., W. 5<sup>th</sup> Spring to Church, Winter St. Front to W. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Summer St. Front to W.3<sup>rd</sup>Street, Spring St. W. Front to W. 2<sup>nd</sup>, Church St. from W. Front to W. 3<sup>rd</sup>, Zinc St., Iron St. from Front to W. 3<sup>rd</sup>, Bike Path on 5<sup>th</sup> Street from Spruce to Eyre Street, and Main St. in Roebling from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> Avenues both sides.

<u>Wilbur Henry Drive</u>: The installation of sidewalks, milling and paving is completed. Raised crosswalks and striping will be completed within the next week.

- 5. Police Department: If you have an emergency, dial 911. If it is a non-emergency requiring police response, call (609) 267-8300. The police lobby window will be open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Wednesday 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. If you require police assistance, please use the yellow call box located by the Municipal Building Main Lobby doors. A police officer will subsequently be dispatched to handle your matter. Please see Police Department website on how to obtain Police Reports, Handicap Placards or call (609) 499-3131.
- 6. Water Service Lines Letters: In July 2021, P.L.2021, Ch.183 (Law) was enacted, requiring all community water systems to replace lead service lines in their service area within 10 years. Under

the law, Florence Township is required to notify customers, non-paying consumers, and any off-site owner of a property (e.g., landlord) when it is known or unknown, if they are served by a lead service line. A letter was sent out on 9/1/22 to those residents this new law may affect. Note that per C.58:12A-41, section 2, the definition of a lead service line now includes lead connectors (lead gooseneck, lead pigtail, or other lead fitting) and galvanized service lines. Our service line inventory is available at www.florence-ni.gov. A service line is a portion of pipe that connects the water main to the building inlet. In Florence Township, the service line is owned entirely by the property owner. The service line materials are [lead/galvanized/unknown]. Florence Township is developing a lead service line replacement program. If you are planning to replace your lead service line, contact us at (609) 499-2518 prior to replacement so that we can coordinate our efforts.

7. Recycling Center: The recycling center hours are: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Saturday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

8. E-Mail Notification for Website Updates: The e-mail sign-up page is now functional on the website. Unfortunately, individuals who signed-up under the old website, will have to sign-up again. When there are website updates, an email notification will be sent out that day around 4pm.

case in our front lobby. **The Drop Box will be checked multiple times daily for your convenience. Payments must be check or money orders, NO CASH.** Please provide a phone number with your payment and we will call to confirm payment was received. Please allow 48 hours for your payment to be posted to our online account portal. Feel free to call the office with any questions, 609-499-2525. The office hours are 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Any documents left in the drop box will be processed and mailed back to residents as needed. The Drop Box is available 24/7 for resident's convenience.

- **13. Construction Office:** The office hours are 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Residents and developers dropping off permits, plans, etc. are encouraged to use the drop box located inside the front entrance to the Municipal Building. Any questions, please call the Construction Office at (609) 499-2130.
